SCIENTIFIC PROJECT: The Doctoral School in the Humanities (= SDiSU) of the University of Trieste provides the institutional and scientific context for doctoral studies in the humanities according to high-quality research standards. The SDISU aims to promote research in an interdisciplinary and international perspective. For this purpose, it coordinates and optimizes the doctoral activities of its 5 individual PhD programs: 1) Antiquities (history archeology, philology), 2) History and Art History, 3) Italian Studies, plus, most probably starting in January 2012 (27th cycle), 4) Philosophy and 5) Translation/Interpreting Studies. Set up within the administrative structure of the Department of Humanities (DISU) the SDiSU organizes and coordinates the activities of the five above-mentioned PhD programs, promoting their cooperation and developing the affinities of their different research methodologies. These affinities can be synthetically - if generically - summarized with the label of Comparative Cultural Studies. This expression refers to the interdiscipline which studies from a comparative and transnational perspective the production and transmission of multifarious and complex cultural objects, i.e. the forms, phenomena and individual/collective agents of social life in history; their (self-)representations and (self-)descriptions in language, iconography, the figurative arts, and documentary and material media; and the forms of conceptualization, formulation, cultural mediation and communication through which they perform the decisional processes that shape their existence. Through its teaching and research activities, both common and specific to each individual program, and by actively promoting the students' participation to Italian and international doctoral networks, the SDiSU aims at training both experts on individual disciplines and researchers with a broader range of interdisciplinary and international skills.

EDUCATIONAL AIMS AND RESEARCH TOPICS: The main formative goal of the doctoral course in Philosophy is to form philosophers: persons that, together with high-level mastery of contents and problems in one or more fields of philosophical research, possess the capacity of thinking critically, reasoning and arguing, forming original ideas, acting (on the basis of the result of their studies) in everyday and social contexts, writing philosophical texts both academic and addressed to a broader public. The acquisition of such a capacity is aimed at by the research project of each doctoral student, at which he or she works under supervision of a tutor. The dialogic aspect of philosophical research is acquired through collaboration and confrontation with the tutor and other teaching staff and the participation in workshops and debates, at the local University or elsewhere, which will on occasion be international in character. As possible fields of social action, beyond the teaching of philosophy, we envisage philosophical counselling and the connections of philosophical reflection with the world of the enterprise. Formation to philosophical writing, the salient moment of which is the writing of the doctoral thesis, is fostered by the production of preparatory papers. In order to achieve internationalization, doctoral students are encouraged to practise philosophical writing not only in the Italian language, but also in other European languages and

especially in English, and are allowed to write their doctoral theses in English or French. Doctoral students are given opportunities of getting acquainted with specialized editing, both traditional and multi-medial.

As to research themes, the doctoral course highlights a group of intertwined themes concerning the subject, knowledge, and language. The problem of subjectivity, discussed both by phenomenologically oriented (or post-phenomenological) philosophy and by the analytic philosophy of mind, calls for connection with research on the cognitive activities of the subject, conducted in the traditional epistemological perspective or in the light of the recent development of cognitive sciences, and with research on language, culture and communication. From this common background, the research of our doctoral students will extend in various directions corresponding to the main specializations represented within the teaching staff, which allow for up to five distinct fields of study:

- 1.Research on ancient or medieval philosophy, paying attention to the linguistic forms and textual genres in which philosophical reflection was cast.
- Research on modern philosophical thought, highlighting the development of the main trends of modern metaphysics and epistemology, as well as the increasing independence of scientific thought from philosophy, and their dialogue.
- 3. Research in contemporary philosophy focusing upon the question of the subject as it crucially emerges in phenomenological and post-phenomenological thought, from Husserl and Heidegger to French contemporary philosophers, in connection with the themes of the other and of philosophical writing.
- 4. Research in the philosophy of language and of mind both within postphenomenological and analytic philosophy, focusing on the intentionality of consciousness as well as on agency, with possible connections to scientific research in the field of social and cognitive science.
- 5. Research in ethics, political philosophy and the philosophy of religion, highlighting the issues related to identity and difference, with their cognitive and practical implications.

EDUCATIONAL AIMS AND RESEARCH TOPICS: The curriculum in Italian Studies offers two lines of specialization.

> The first one focuses on issues related to the rise and development of mass literature and culture. The purpose of this specialization is to provide postgraduate students with an expertise in modern and contemporary literature,

together with a background in literary theory and critical methodology and a strong competence in the history of mass literary genres. Specific research topics include the analysis of theses genres (crime, mystery, detective and spy stories, science fiction, women's fiction, feuilletons and so on), the investigation of the processes of reception of literary texts, reading practices and audiences formation since the 18th century, the study of the relationships between literature and journalism and other phenomena that characterize mass culture. Along these lines, the course offers an interdisciplinary study of Italian literature conducted in connection with sociological, anthropological and linguistic perspectives, with the consideration of figurative and performing arts and a constant attention to other European literary cultures.

The second line of specialization, in cooperation with the University of Bari, focuses on literary and cultural relations in the Adriatic area. It aims at studying the presence of Italian culture in the area, with particular reference to Italian language and literature. It offers a specific knowledge and methodological preparation for carrying out research in libraries and archives in the Adriatic areas. Research topics include travel literature, history of translation into Italian, publishing history and the study of Italian writers living in those areas.

EDUCATIONAL AIMS AND RESEARCH TOPICS: The specialization in History and History of Art aims at providing high scientific education up to European standards with a cross disciplinary approach. The chronological span (ranging from medieval and early modern to contemporary age) is very wide and makes this programme a unique didactic opportunity in the local region. A strong international connotation is given by joint research projects, trans-national agreements and cooperation. Historical studies are mainly focused on cultural and socio-economic topics related to the Mediterranean, the Balkans and Central Europe, paying attention to the relationships between European and non-European areas. The programme encompasses also linguistic aspects, eq. didactic, public, mass-media and multimedia communication.

AIMS AND RESEARCH TOPICS: The Ph.D. program in Interpreting and Translation Studies focuses on the professional aspects of both written and oral interlinguistic/intercultural mediation in various languages (Arabic, Dutch, English, French, German, Portuguese, Russian, Serbian and Croatian, Spanish), with particular reference to the special languages of technology, science, law, economics and finance. The program aims at 1) developing theoretical, methodological and analytical abilities to enable the students to undertake original research within the different areas of Translation and Interpreting Studies, and 2) training highly qualified professionals to satisfy the demand for global linguistic solutions requested by today's language industry (Computer-Aided and Machine Translation, multilingual editing, localization, terminology/terminography, multilingual design of Web pages, audiovisual translation, with particular reference to subtitling and dubbing etc.). At the end of the course, students will have the necessary skills, self-awareness and confidence to undertake an active role in the process of linguistic and cultural mediation acting as consultants on the best way to meet the results expected by their clients.

> As well as and developing their own research project and attending both the seminars which make up the teaching activities specific to the course (mainly in Italian but also in English) and the seminars which are common to all 5 programs of the PhD School in Humanities, students are expected to participate actively in (inter)national conferences and the research projects currently under way in the Department of Language, Interpreting and Translation Studies (DSLIT) organizing the Ph.D. course. Students are also expected to spend some months abroad preparing their dissertation at any of the universities in Croatia, Germany, Ireland, Slovenia, Spain and the United Kingdom which are part of the consortium of the PhD program or any (non) European university which is a research centre of excellence in the specific field of study chosen by the students. An integral part of the course is finally an internship at one of the European "solution centres" of the international language service provider participating in the PhD. Upon students' request and provided they satisfy the established criteria, candidates can be awarded a "European Doctorate". Another possibility of being awarded an international doctorate is via a collaborative PhD degree, awarded by the University of Trieste and another European university.
