OVERVIEW: The Doctoral School in the Humanities was born from the union of three pre-existing doctoral courses of the University of Trieste, each of whom with a long and peculiar tradition: the doctorate in Italian literature and philology, the doctorate in "Forms of historical knowledge from the Middle Ages to the contemporary age" and the doctorate in Ancient Studies. At present it is based at the Department of History and Cultures from the Antiquity to the contemporary age (=DISCAM). The School - the details of whose organization and scientific purposes are illustrated by its website - is structured in three courses ("indirizzi"), each corresponding to the previous doctorates and on a modular plan, capable of incorporating more courses of humanistic content. It is governed by a Director, a Scientific Board and the College of Professors. Its main objective is to work on the basis of the disciplinary and methodological autonomy of each component, under the supervision of the Scientific Board, and to develop as much as possible the interdisciplinary perspectives and approaches between literary, historical, archeological, art-historical and ancient classic studies, with significant openings towards the juridical, philosophical and political science studies. Each course, under the guide of its College of Professors, works autonomously as far as the recruiting procedures, didactics, periodic evaluations and final examinations procedures are concerned. At the same time, each course cooperates yearly to a common program consisting of monthly scientific meetings on a general topic to be dealt with on an interdisciplinary basis. More activities aim to give the students the necessary knowledge and competences in order to move autonomously on the level of international research. The students are recruited with distinct examinations for each course and are requested to participate regularly to the activities decided by the College of Professors of the course and of the School. The Professors of the School ensure constant supervision to the students' research work for the final thesis; and the School supports the latter, in cooperation with the DISCAM, in order to guarantee the students structures and resources necessary for achieving its institutional aims. The School assists its students in developing their national and international relationships; it favors the publication of their studies and offers support and counseling in view of postdoctoral research or working activities. OVERVIEW: The curriculum in Italian Studies offers two lines of specialization.

The first one focuses on issues related to the rise and development of mass literature and culture. The purpose of this specialization is to provide postgraduate students with an expertise in modern and contemporary literature, together with a background in literary theory and critical methodology and a strong competence in the history of mass literary genres. Specific research topics include the analysis of theses genres (crime, mystery, detective and spy stories, science fiction, women's fiction, feuilletons and so on), the investigation of the processes of reception of literary texts, reading practices and audiences formation since the 18th century, the study of the relationships between literature and journalism and other phenomena that characterize mass culture. Along these lines, the course offers an interdisciplinary study of Italian literature conducted in connection with sociological, anthropological and linguistic perspectives, with the consideration of figurative and performing arts and a constant attention to other European literary cultures.

The second line of specialization, in cooperation with the University of Bari, focuses on literary and cultural relations in the Adriatic area. It aims at studying the presence of Italian culture in the area, with particular reference to Italian language and literature. It offers a specific knowledge and methodological preparation for carrying out research in libraries and archives in the Adriatic areas. Research topics include travel literature, history of translation into Italian, publishing history and the study of Italian writers living in those areas.

OVERVIEW:

The specialization in History and History of Art aims at providing high scientific education up to European standards with a cross disciplinary approach. The chronological span covered (ranging from medieval and early modern to contemporary age) is very wide and makes this programme a unique didactic opportunity in the local region. A strong international connotation is given by joint research projects, trans-national agreements and cooperation. Historical studies are mainly focused on cultural and socio-economic topics related to the Mediterranean, the Balkans and Central Europe, paying attention to the relationships between European and non-European areas. The programme encompasses also linguistic aspects, eg didactic, public, mass-media and multi-media communication.
