OVERVIEW: Penal law – thus criminal law - is diachronically dyscrasic, having developed and specialized through time with no connection to practical consequences on bordering fields. However, it is jeopardized by a tendency towards abstraction, ideological conditioning and cultural solipsism. On the contrary, the research and learning outcomes of this programme start, however, from the concept of an integrated penal system. If penalty characterizes the penal system, attention focuses on sanctions both in terms of lawmaking and in terms of enforcement. This specific training provides the basic knowledge required as well as critical thinking and evaluation skills.

The three-year programme is structured as follows:

Two years are devoted to the study of various disciplines considered as an integrated penal system focusing on criminal sanctions, with special reference to the relationships between law, offenders, and penalties/security measures, on penal procedures, particularly special procedures and Juvenile Courts, on penitentiary law and in particular decarceration measures. Criminology and forensic medicine provide further specialization and terms of comparison.

The third year is devoted to specific topics. Each student tackles the subject matter for his/her thesis. Three specializations are offered: penal law, criminal prosecution and criminology
